Did you know that the WCA motto is "For the Future?" With that in mind, and the long anticipated "Revived and Thriving" celebration just ten days away, the theme of revitalization encompasses many WCA happenings this spring.

To celebrate our renaissance, we'll recognize and honor members and supporters who were instrumental to the rebirth of our club 20 years ago, noting a resurgence in membership from three elderly women to about 200 women of all ages.
