

Online Membership Payment Convenience Fee Starts March 1, 2024

Did you know that there are costs associated with credit card payments to the club? Card payment fees add up and are costly to businesses and nonprofits. When dining out, for example, you may receive a discount for paying with cash rather than card.

Committees and the Board continue to discuss best practices for the WCA. In an effort to balance the convenience of online payments with fiscal management efforts, *effective March 1, 2024, membership dues paid online will include a convenience fee to cover the cost to the club.*
